RE: Application for Insurance Producer License

Dear Ms. Irizarry,

This letter is to notify you that your application for licensure as a nonresident insurance producer in South Dakota has been denied. The reason for the denial is as follows:

You submitted an application for an individual nonresident insurance producer license to the South Dakota Division of Insurance ("Division") on October 22, 2018. On your answer to the application questions concerning misdemeanor and felony convictions, you indicated have misdemeanor and felony convictions. You provided documentation of your felony convictions with your application.

The Division wrote to you on October 31, 2018 to request a written explanation regarding why you did not provide documentation of your misdemeanor convictions, copies of charging documents, and copies of documentation indicating the final resolution of the charges. You responded to the Division on the same day with the requested documentation.

Based on the above information, your application is denied based upon SDCL §§ 58-30-167(2) and (6) for violating the insurance laws or rules and for having a felony conviction.

Please note that this denial is considered an administrative action which will be reported to the database maintained by the National Association of Insurance Commissioners. If an administrative action occurs, an insurance producer may be required to report the action to any and all states in which an insurance license is held and in accordance with the timeframes and requirements of each state.

Pursuant to SDCL § 58-30-168, you may make a written request to the Division of Insurance within thirty days of the date of this denial for a hearing to determine the reasonableness of this decision to deny your application for licensure.
